Call to order by Chris Ruetz at 2:02.

Public Comments: Paul Hinrichsen overheard the confusion many of the board members expressed about navigating around in Google Docs. He offered to work with Richard Allegra to put together a tutorial to remedy the situation. Paul also suggested that to 'fill in the map' that it be done administratively to redraw the boundaries of existing NOrgs to include unrepresented areas. If those areas wished to form their own NOrg down the road the map could be redrawn again. Bob Heinbaugh suggested the board form an ad hoc committee to explore both sides of the issue of an elected mayor.

Approval of Agenda and Minutes from 3.02.2026 (as corrected) motion made by Dan Gonnella, 2nd by Ned Barker passed with none opposed.

Treasurer's Report by Cat Gallivan reported a March ending balance of \$23,275.69 plus the \$50,000 held in CDs. CD#1 matures on April 22nd. Chris Ruetz made a motion to carry the CD forward as is, 2nd by Dan Fast passed with none opposed. As of the March ending balance \$227.87 has been earned on it. The Measure J account has had no activity and there is still a balance \$44,601.36 in it. The 17th Annual ONE-PS Picnic surpassed its goal this year. Work is ongoing to collect some outstanding commitments but the estimate of unused revenue is \$6,608 beyond the \$9,850 of known expenses. Reimbursements of related expenses need to have the forms and receipts to receive payment. An executive summary was requested to be added to the Treasurers Report in the future. Cat reminded the board that she will be stepping down as treasurer at the end of the year and recruitment or a nominating committee should be in place soon. She also reminded the board that a budget for FY2026-27 needs to be ready for June approval by BOD, posted for membership to view, and a membership approval vote in July.

Committees and Task Forces discussion led off by Chris Ruetz commending the committee and all the volunteers for the success of the 17th Annual ONE-PS Picnic and Community Expo. Denise Goolsby said that thank you letters have been sent to all vendors, sponsors, city departments, and participants. The leftover volunteer t-shirts will be offered to membership at the next meeting for \$20. Dave Manley is still processing the lessons learned from this event but better marketing to Palm Springs residents is top of mind.

Candidates Forum comments by Tim Schoeffler confirmed conversation with John Bolton to perhaps have the event at the Plaza Theatre on the 3rd or 4th Saturday in September at 10a. Mark Talkington has agreed to moderate the event again. Plans to address the mayoral election issue are still unfolding.

Fall Modernism Event by Tim Schoeffler revealed plans for a shorter walk with La Plaza dorms, Plaza Theatre green room and dressing rooms, O'Donnell Golf Club House, and American Legion all back again. The event will be October 16th from 9:30a-12:30p with tickets priced at \$100. Arrangements for the volunteer event from last year's walk were discussed and being finalized.

Pride Parade update by Patrick Stonebraker centers around improving participation by all the NOrgs. Distributing the blade signs made for last year's event to those who weren't there was also discussed.

NODA Report by Ned Barker confirmed the date of the next ceremony to coincide with the December 8th membership meeting. Nick Gonzales has agreed to allow use of the Palm Springs Pavilion for the event. Ned presented a detailed budget with plans for a vendor fair, paid advertising in the program, and sponsor banners to generate revenue. Event expenses for vendor contact info, program and postcard design/printing/mailing, a web-based app for payments and tracking, and hospitality/trophy costs would potentially still net over \$6,000 in revenue for ONE-PS.

Food Desert Task Force had no report.

Neighborhood Magazine update by Chris Ruetz requested that Eric Chiel provide a written budget and proposal to evaluate the viability of the project.

Website & Communications Committee report by Dave Manley indicates continuing work on a portal for accepting electronic payments. This would make it possible to offer ONE-PS merchandise for sale too.

Old Business Report by Chris Ruetz and Denise Goolsby reveals that the blade signs have been sent out for fabrication with installation hopefully completed by the resumption of meetings in September.

ONE-PS Committees Build-Out update by Tim Schoeffler presented a preliminary list of committees. Board members would chair 3-6 participants from the membership. Fintech, Traffic Safety, Fire Safety, and Events are all part of the structure.

Membership Meetings April presentation will be Palm Springs Parks Foundation. An update on the convention center will be presented in May.
